AN ACT to amend the Bread Act, 1903.

[Assented to 14th December, 1906.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Bread Amendment Act, 1906*, Short title. and shall be read as one with the Bread Act, 1903.

2. It shall be unlawful, on the third Wednesday in every calendar month, for any person carrying on the business of a baker or seller of bread to employ any person to sell or deliver bread elsewhere than in the shop or premises of such first-mentioned person:

Bread carters' holiday to be observed.

Provided that this section shall not apply to a delivery of bread to any ship or vessel, or to the Commissioner of Railways for delivery by him, but in case such delivery be made by a person in the regular employment of a baker or seller of bread, then it shall be unlawful to employ such person on the day following such third Wednesday.

When public holiday conceded in any month, the third Wednesday not to be observed as a holiday.

**3.** If one or more public holidays are conceded by the employers to the bread carters in any month, the third Wednesday in such month, except the months in which Good Friday and Christmas Day occur, shall not be observed as a holiday.

Application.

**4.** This Act shall only apply to the district comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth.
