AN ACT to confirm certain Expenditure for the Year ended the 30th day of June, One thousand nine hundred and seven.

[Assented to 20th December, 1907.]

WHEREAS it is necessary that Legislative authority be obtained Preamble. for certain expenditure incurred for the service of the financial year 1906-7, not included in any Appropriation Act: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Expenditure set forth in Schedule A to this Act Expenditure, shall be, and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State, that is to say: The sum of Seventy-eight thousand two hundred and forty pounds fourteen shillings and eight pence.

Expenditure, Schedule C. 2. The Expenditure set forth in Schedule B to this Act shall be, and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the General Loan Fund of the State, that is to say: The sum of Ten thousand five hundred and eighty-four pounds ten shillings and ten pence.

3. The Expenditure set forth in Schedule C to this Act shall be, and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the Loan Suspense Account of the State, that is to say the sum of One thousand four hundred and four pounds thirteen shillings and one penny.
