AN ACT to authorise the Construction of a Railway from Menzies to Leonora.

[Assented to, 16th December, 1899.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. THIS Act may be cited as the Menzies-Leonora Railway Short title. Act, 1899.
- 2. IT shall be lawful to construct and maintain a railway from Menzies to Leonora, with all necessary, proper, and usual works and Anthority to conconveniences in connection therewith, along the line described in the Schedule to this Act.

Deviation.

3. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the Railways Act, 1878, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Railways to deviate from the line as described in such Schedule to the extent of ten miles on either side thereof.

SCHEDULE.

MENZIES-LEONORA RAILWAY.

DESCRIPTION OF LINE OF RAILWAY.

Commencing at a point in or near Menzies townsite, and proceeding thence in a generally North-Easterly direction for about 65 miles, thence proceeding in a Westerly direction for about 12 miles, and terminating at a point in or near Leonora townsite, as more particularly delineated by a red line on Map marked P.W.D., W.A., 7097, deposited as provided for by 55° Victoriæ, No. 34, Section 10.
