AN ACT to repeal Duties on Live Stock and Frozen Meat.

[Assented to, 5th October, 1900.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. ON and after the coming into operation of this Act, all duties of customs imposed upon cattle (including bullocks, steers, cows, and calves), pigs and sheep (including wethers, ewes, and lambs), and upon frozen and chilled meat other than pork, are hereby repealed. Repeal.

2. EVERY person exhibiting for sale imported frozen or chilled meat shall affix thereto a label stating distinctly and legibly, in printed or written characters, that such meat is imported frozen meat or imported chilled meat, as the case may be. Persons selling chilled or frozen meat to label the same.

Repeal of Duties on Live Stock and Frozen Meat.

Penalty.

3. IF any person fails to comply with the provisions of the last preceding section, he shall be guilty of an offence, and, upon conviction thereof by a Court of summary jurisdiction, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.
