AN ACT to vest certain Land at Coolgardie in the Municipality of Coolgardie for a Mining Exhibition and other purposes.

[Assented to, 28th October, 1898.]

DE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. THE Governor may grant to the Council of the Municipality of Coolgardie and their successors (hereinafter referred to as "the Power to grant land. Council") the land described in the Schedule hereto, in fee simple, for a Mining Exhibition and a School of Mines, Technological Institute and Geological Museum, and for other municipal purposes.

2. THE Council may from time to time raise any sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the aggregate Five thousand pounds, to Power to mortgage. provide funds to be applied towards the cost of buildings and other improvements to be made on the said land, for the purposes aforesaid, and may secure the repayment thereof, with interest, by way of

mortgage of the said land, and may guarantee any such loan. Provided that no mortgagee shall be bound or required to see to the application of such moneys or be affected by the mis-application or non-application thereof; and in case of the exercise by the mortgagee of the power of sale, the purchaser shall hold the said land freed from the purposes for which it shall have been granted as atoresaid. Provided also that no security given under the provisions of this Act shall involve the Mayor or Councillors in personal liability.

Provisions of Part VIII. of 59 Viet., No. 10, not to apply.

- 3. THE provisions of Part VIII. of the Municipal Institutions Act, 1895, shall not apply to any money raised under this Act.
- Provisions of Police Act may be applied to the Exhibition premises.
- 4. THE Governor may from time to time, by proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare and direct that the provisions of the Police Act, 1892, and of any Act amending the same, shall apply, either absolutely or for such period as may be expressed in such proclamation, to the said land and the buildings to be erected thereon, or that the premises shall be a public place or place of public resort within the meaning of the said Act; and thereupon, so long as any such proclamation shall be in force, it shall be sufficient, for the purpose of conviction, to allege and prove that any offence punishable under the said Act was committed upon or within the said premises.

In the name and on behalf of the Queen I hereby assent to this Act.
