An Act to authorise the Closing of a certain Street in the Township of Busselton.

[Assented to 1st November, 1894.

HEREAS a certain piece of land, situate in the Township of Preamble Busselton, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, has hitherto been reserved and marked on the plans of the said township as a Public Road or Thoroughfare, but the said land has never or but seldom been so used : And whereas it is expedient that the said piece of land should cease to be a Public Road or Thoroughfare : Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. All rights of way (if any) in and over the said piece of land shall Rights of way henceforth cease and determine, and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, to deal with the said piece of land as if it never had been a public road or thoroughfare.
