AN ACT for the Licensing of Refreshment Rooms on Railways and at Theatres.

[Assented to, 11th September, 1895.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. THIS Act may be cited as "The Railway and Theatre Refreshment Rooms Licensing Act, 1895," and is divided into parts, as follows:—

PART I.—REFRESHMENT ROOMS AT THEATRES.

PART II.—RAILWAY REFRESHMENT ROOMS.

2. IN this Act the expression "Principal Act" shall mean "The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Act, 1880," and any Act Interpretation. amending the same.

PART I.—REFRESHMENT ROOMS AT THEATRES.

Incorporation with "Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Act, 1880," and its amendments.

- THIS part of this Act shall be incorporated with and read as part of the Principal Act.
- Room License.
- IN addition to the licenses mentioned in Section 4 of the Theatre Refreshment Principal Act, there may be granted a theatre refreshment room license in the First Form of the First Schedule to this Act.

Annual Fee.

THE annual fee for such license shall be Fifteen pounds, and Section 15 of the Principal Act shall be read to include such license and fee in addition to the licenses and fees therein mentioned.

To whom License may be granted.

ANY such license may be granted to the owner, lessee, or occupier of any theatre, or to any other person with the consent of such owner, lessee, or occupier, and the notice of application for the same shall be made in the Second Form of the First Schedule to this Act.

Effect of License.

THE person so licensed may sell liquor at a refreshment room at the theatre, and shall, for that purpose, enjoy the same rights and privileges as the holder of a publican's general license; Provided that liquor shall not be sold at such theatre save on the occasion of a concert or theatrical or other public performance at the theatre, and not on the Lord's Day, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

Licensed premises.

ANY room or rooms in which liquor is sold by any such licensee shall be deemed to be the licensed premises within the meaning of the Principal Act.

PART II.—RAILWAY REFRESHMENT ROOMS.

Interpretation.

IN this part of this Act the word "Commissioner" shall mean the Commissioner of Railways for Western Australia for the time being, and the words "General Manager," the General Manager for the time being of any private railway.

Repeal of part of s. 37 of 42 Vict., No.

10. IN Section thirty-seven of the Act 42 Victoria, No. 31, all the words which follow the word "refreshments," to the end of the Section, are repealed.

Railway refreshment rooms.

(1.) ON the application of the lessee or occupier of any refreshment room or stand at a railway station (which application shall be made in writing in the First Form of the Second Schedule to this Act), and upon payment of a fee, to be fixed, in the case of

a public railway, by the Commissioner, and in the case of a private railway, by the Colonial Treasurer, of not less than Five pounds and not more than Thirty pounds, the Commissioner in the first of such cases and the Colonial Treasurer in the second may grant to the applicant a license in the Second Form of the same Schedule for the sale of liquor at the refreshment room or stand for the period of one year from the date of the license.

- (2.) The person so licensed may sell liquor at such refreshment room or stand, and shall for that purpose enjoy the same rights and privileges as the holder of a publican's general license: provided that liquor shall be sold at such room or stand only within a reasonable time before and after the arrival or departure of any passenger train at or from such station; but this proviso shall not render illegal a sale to any person who may be a bonû fide lodger in any premises let at any such station for the accommodation of travellers.
- 12. THE Commissioner, in the case of a public railway, and the General Manager in the case of a private railway, may from time to regulations and time make, alter, or repeal such regulations for the proper ordering cancel licenses. and maintenance of any railway refreshment rooms or stands as he may deem necessary, and the Commissioner or the Colonial Treasurer may at any time cancel any license issued by them respectively under the provisions of this Act.

In the name and on behalf of the Queen I hereby assent to this Act.
