AN ACT to amend the Jury Act, 1871.

[Assented to, 27th October, 1896.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. THE twenty-fourth section of the Jury Act, 1871, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is enacted as follows:—

Every person attending the Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court, or the Courts of General Quarter Sessions in the Colony, shall be entitled to receive payment at the rate of Ten shillings a day for each day of attendance.

2. SUBJECT as hereinafter mentioned, in lieu of mileage payable to jurors under the said Act there shall be paid to every juror, in addition to the sum payable for his attendance, the return fare from the railway station nearest to his residence to the place where the Court which he attends is held: Provided that the juror shall

be entitled to receive the further sum of Eightpence per mile in respect of so much of the distance between his residence and the Court as no railway is available for. Such return fare and mileage shall be payable for each day of attendance.

Incorporation.

3. THIS Act shall be read and construed together with the Jury Act, 1871, and its amendments.

Short title.

4. THIS Act may be cited as the Jury Act Amendment Act, 1896.
