A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to further amend "The Constitution Act. 1889."

[Reserved, 19th November, 1894.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

ON and after the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, the seventieth section of "The Constitution Repeal of Section 70 of Act, 1889," and Schedule C of that Act, shall cease to have any 52 Vic., No. 23. force or effect; and the funds necessary for the relief and for assisting generally to promote the preservation and well-being of the aboriginal inhabitants of Western Australia shall be such as may be provided by Parliament from time to time.

I reserve this Bill for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure.
