An Act to amend the Law relating to Appeals in Criminal Cases. [Assented to 14th September, 1893.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law relating to Appeals Preamble in Criminal Matters: Be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the

Criminal Law Appeal

Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as 'The Criminal Law Appeal Act, 1893.'

Appeal to Supreme Court shall be determined by a Judge thereof, and not by full Court 2. Whenever in any Act or Ordinance a right of appeal is given against any order or conviction of any Justice or Justices of the Peace to the Supreme Court, such appeal shall be heard and determined by a Judge thereof, and not by the full Court as constituted by 'The Supreme Court Act, 1880.' Provided that nothing herein contained shall in any way affect or take away the right which any person may possess, under any Act or Ordinance, to have a case stated upon a question of law.

No appeal from Judge save for error of law upon the record 3. No appeal shall lie from any judgment of any Judge of the Supreme Court, in any criminal cause or matter, save for some error of law apparent upon the record as to which no question has been reserved for the consideration of the Judges of the Supreme Court under an Act passed in the Fiftieth year of Her Majesty, number Fifteen, intituled 'An Act to amend the Criminal Law Procedure.'

Case stated to be determined by full Court

4. All cases stated by a Court of summary jurisdiction upon any question of law, in any criminal cause or matter, shall be heard and determined by the full Court.

Incorporation

5. This Act shall be incorporated and read with 'The Supreme Court Act, 1880,' and an Act passed in the Fiftieth year of Her present Majesty, number Twenty-eight, intituled 'An Act to amend "The Supreme Court Act, 1880."
