An Act to make it lawful to close up a certain Street in the City of Perth. [Assented to 13th October, 1893.

WHEREAS a Right-of-way over certain Land in the City of Perth, known as Kensington Lane, is existing and enjoyed by the Public; and whereas it is expedient that the said Right-of-way should cease and determine: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as 'The Kensington Lane Closure Act.' Short title

The Kensington Lane Closure Act

Closure of Kensington Lane 2. All rights-of-way in and over the piece or parcel of land which lies between Hutt Street and Melbourne Street (commonly called Melbourne Road), in the City of Perth, known as Kensington Lane, and containing two roods twenty-nine perches more or less, shall henceforth cease and determine; and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to deal with the said piece or parcel of land as if it had never been dedicated to the use of the Public.

Power to lay lines across Hutt Street 3. The Commissioner of Railways may cause such lines of railway as he thinks fit to be laid, constructed, and maintained upon and across any portion or portions of Hutt Street lying between Roe Street and Wellington Street.
