AN ACT to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the Service of the year ending the last day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament.

[Assented to, 18th March, 1892.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,----

7E, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia in Parlia- Preamble. ment assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this Session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted; And be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows (that is to say):—

VICTORIÆ, No. 8. 55°

Appropriation—1892.

OUT of the Consolidated Revenue there shall and may be 1. Application of issued and applied, for or towards making good the Supply granted to Her Majesty, a sum not exceeding Three Hundred and Ninety-four Thousand Four Hundred and Forty-nine Pounds Three Shillings and Fivepence for the service of the year ending the Thirty-first day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

> ALL sums granted by this Act, and the Act mentioned in 2. the First Schedule to this Act, out of the said Consolidated Revenue, towards making good the Supply granted to Her Majesty, amounting as appears by the said Schedule in the aggregate to the sum of Four Hundred and Seventy-four Thousand Four Hundred and Fortynine Pounds Three Shillings and Fivepence, are appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of the Act mentioned in the said First Schedule. for the purposes and services expressed in the Second Schedule hereto.

In the name and on behalf of the Queen I hereby assent to this Act.
