AN ACT to provide for the Payment of certain additional and unforeseen Expenses in the year One thousand eight hundred and eightyseven, over and above the Estimates for that year.

Assented to, 20th August, 1887.

THEREAS the Governor and Legislative Council have authorised to be issued and applied out of the General Revenue of the Colony the several sums hereinafter mentioned to provide for the payment of certain additional and unforeseen expenses for the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and eightyseven, over and above the Estimates for the same: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. THAT out of the General Public Revenue, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there shall and may be issued and applied ation of £49,984 18s. to defray the supplementary charge for the service of the year 6d. for the year 1887. ending the thirty-first day of December, One thousand eight hundred

and eighty-seven, and not provided for in the Appropriation Act for that year, a sum not exceeding Forty-nine thousand nine hundred and eighty-four pounds eighteen shillings and sixpence, the said amount being appropriated as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Treasurer to pay on Governor's Warrant.

2. THE Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay such sum or sums of money for the purposes aforesaid, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf specified in the Schedule hereto, as the Governor shall from time to time by warrant under his hand direct.

In the name and on behalf of the Queen I hereby assent to this Act.
