An Act to amend an Ordinance intituled 'An Ordinance to provide for the establishment of Proper Places for the Burial of the Dead' (10 Vic., No. 12).

[Assented to 3rd December, 1888.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council, by proclamation, to declare the closure of any cemetery or burial place. Governor may close cemetery
2. From and after such proclamation any person who shall assist, within the meaning of the 10 Vic., No. 12, at the burial of any dead body in any cemetery or burial place which shall have been closed as aforesaid, shall be subject to the penalties in the said Ordinance mentioned. Penalty for assisting at burial in a closed cemetery
3. Notwithstanding the preceding sections, it shall be lawful for the Governor to grant special permission to bury a dead body in any cemetery or burial place closed under this Act. Special permission
4. This Act shall be read and construed together with the said Ordinance. Construction of Act
5. This Act may be cited as 'The Cemetery Closure Act, 1888.' Short title
