AN ACT to amend "The Destruction of Rabbits Act, 1883."

[Assented to, 18th September, 1885.]

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to amend the Act for the Destruction of Rabbits, so as to extend its provisions to all lands comprised within the territorial limits of Western Australia: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. THIS Act may be cited as "The Destruction of Rabbits Short Title. Amendment Act, 1885."

2. SECTION 4 of "The Destruction of Rabbits Act, 1883," is hereby repealed. Repeal of Sec. 4 of 47 Vic., No. 15.

3. SECTION 7 of the said Act is hereby amended, by omitting the words "exclusive of the use of poison, unless with the occupier's consent." Sec. 7 of 47 Vict., No. 15, amended.

Destruction of Rabbits Act—Amendment.

Inspectors shall present annual report to Governor.

4. EVERY Inspector appointed by the Governor under the provisions of the aforesaid Act shall, not later than the last day of June in each year, send in a report to the Governor, containing particulars as to whether any, and, if any, what number of rabbits have been reported to him or are known by him to exist in his district, and what steps he has taken for their destruction; which report shall be laid before the Legislative Council at the next sitting thereof.
