An Act to explain 'The Superannuation Act.'

[Assented to 18th September, 1885.]

WHEREAS the word 'emoluments' occurring throughout 'The Superannuation Act' is liable to be misconstrued: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. The word 'emoluments,' wherever such word occurs in 'The Superannuation Act,' shall not be construed, taken, or held to include any table, forage, or travelling allowance, nor any income derived from the private practice by any officer of his calling, business, or profession.

2. This Act and 'The Superannuation Act' shall be read and construed together as one Act.
