An Act to prohibit the use of Dynamite or other explosive substances for the purpose of catching or destroying Fish in Western Australia.

[Assented to 8th August, 1879.

E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as 'The Fisheries (Dynamite) Act, 1879.' Short title
- 2. Any person who uses Dynamite or other explosive substances to Australia, shall be liable, on summary conviction before a Resident stances in the Magistrate or a Police Magistrate or two Justices of the Peace in Petty Sessions, either to a fine not exceeding Twenty Pounds. Sessions, either to a fine not exceeding Twenty Pounds, or, in the discretion of the Court, to be imprisoned with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding two calendar months.
