AN ACT to repeal "The Tariff Act, 1872," and to make other provision in lieu thereof.

[Assented to, 7th September, 1876.]

W HEREAS it is expedient to repeal "The Tariff Act, 1872," Preamble. and to make other provision in lieu thereof; Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1 "THE Tariff Act, 1872" shall be and the same is hereby Repeal of "The Tariff Act, repealed.

2 FROM and after the passing of this Act, there shall be Duties upon goods. charged, raised, collected, levied, and paid upon all goods, wares, articles, merchandise and things, not enumerated or included in the Second Schedule to this Act, such duties as are respectively specified Schedule Two. Schedule to this Act.

#### Tariff, 1876.

Manner of collecting and levying duties.

THE said duties shall be collected and levied in the manner 3 provided by, and subject and according to the provisions of, any Ordinance, Act, or Law for the time being in force for the general regulation of the Customs of the Colony.

Drawback to be allowed on cases. Schedule Three.

4 WHEN any articles enumerated in the Third Schedule to certain goods in certain this Act have been put on board any ship for the bona fide purpose of forming part of the stores or equipments of the same, the Collector or other Principal Officer of Customs, on proof being given to his satisfaction of the premises and that the duties required by this or any other Act have been duly paid on the importation of the same into the Colony, shall refund to the master or owner of such ship an amount equal to seventy-five per centum of the duties payable under this Act on the importation of the said articles.

Short Title.

5 THIS Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Tariff Act, 1876."
