AN ACT to make perpetual an Ordinance intituled "An Ordinance for taking an account of the Population and of the amount of Live Stock and Crop and other Particulars of the Colony of Western Australia."

[Assented to, 28th July, 1880.]

 $\mathcal{T}\mathrm{HEREAS}$ an Ordinance was passed in the twelfth year of Her present Majesty, No. 4, intituled "An Ordinance for taking an account of the Population and of the amount of Live Stock and Crop and other Particulars of the Colony of Western Australia;" And whereas doubts have arisen as to whether the said Ordinance is still in force: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :--

1 THE said Ordinance shall be and the same is hereby made Ordinance 12th Vict., No. perpetual.

The Census Act, 1880.

Powers and authorities given and duties imposed by the said Ordinance to be exercised and discharged from time to time hereafter.

2 THE powers and authorities by the said Ordinance given to the Governor and to Justices of the Peace may be exercised, and the duties by the said Ordinance imposed on persons shall be discharged, and the penalties thereby imposed shall be enforced from time to time and at all times hereafter in manner by the said Ordinance provided.

Short Title.

3 THIS Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Census Act, 1880."
