An Ordinance to naturalize Bartolomi Ramis.

[Assented to 15th July, 1867.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to bring into operation the Ordinance No. 3 of 1866, intituled 'An Ordinance to naturalize Bartolomi Ramis;' And whereas the said Bartolomi Ramis hath resided in and observed the laws of Western Australia during the period of fourteen years and upwards; Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. The said recited Ordinance shall come into operation and the said Bartolomi Ramis shall receive the benefit thereof, upon his taking and subscribing the Oath of Allegiance to Her Most Gracious Majesty, before the Chief Justice of the said Colony or any Justice of the Peace thereof notwithstanding the suspending clause therein provided.

2. The said Oath of Allegiance shall be deposited in the Supreme Court office and may be inspected and copies thereof may be taken as in the case of other documents deposited in the said office.
