AN ACT to amend the "Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance, 1866," and to Repeal the "Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance Amendment Act, 1871."

[Assented to, 30th August, 1872.

HEREAS it is expedient to amend the 8th Section of the Preamble. "Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance, 1866," and to repeal the "Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance Amendment Act, 1871," and to enact other provisions in lieu thereof; Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:-

1 THE Fees payable for Licenses to be issued under the eighth License Fees. Section of the "Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance, 1866," shall be from and after the passing of this Act Twopence instead of Sixpence and Fourpence instead of One shilling as therein provided.

2 IF during the continuance of any License to cleanse infected Owner neglecting to take sheep the owner to whom the same is granted shall not take measures for cleansing measures for the effectual cleansing of the sheep mentioned therein to same to be dipped.

#### Scab-in-Sheep—Amendment.

Order subject to appeal to two Justices.

the satisfaction of the Inspector and if injury is likely to ensue to flocks belonging to other persons and depastured on lands contiguous to such infected sheep in consequence of the owner refusing or neglecting to cleanse them it shall be competent for the Inspector to issue an order to such owner to dip such infected sheep within fourteen days. Provided that any such order by an Inspector shall be subject to an appeal to any two or more Justices who shall have power to confirm vary or annul such order; such appeal shall be heard and determined within fourteen days after such order shall have been made as aforesaid; And on its being made to appear that such order has not been complied with it shall be lawful for two or more Justices on the application of the Inspector to order such infected sheep to be dipped by the Inspector or by some person employed by him and the expense incident to such dipping shall be borne by the owner of such infected sheep.

Inspector may employ persons to assist in dipping.

3 ANY Inspector may employ any person to assist in dipping any sheep ordered to be dipped under the provisions of this Act; And if any owner refuses to pay the expenses incident to such dipping they may be recovered summarily in like manner as other penalties under the "Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance, 1866."

Interpretation.

4 DIPPING shall mean total immersion in any wash known to be a specific for the cure of scab.

Short Title.

6 THIS Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Scab-in-Sheep Amendment Act, 1872."
