AN ORDINANCE to explain an Ordinance to regulate Friendly Societies.

[7th July, 1865.]

HEREAS by the sixth section of the Ordinance of the Legis- 27 Vict., No. 6, S 6. lative Council, passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Queen Victoria, No. 6, of 1863, it is provided, that before the Governor shall confirm the Rules of any Society established thereunder, assuring to any member any annuity, the contributions in respect to such annuity, shall be certified to such Governor, by the Auditor-General: Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency The Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Friendly Societies, Explanation.
