AN ORDINANCE to amend "The Jury Ordinance,
1858."

[11th July, 1864.]

WHEREAS it is expedient that the prohibition against any allowance for travelling and other expenses being made to Jurors attending Criminal Trials should be removed: Be it enacted by His Excellency The Governor of Western Australia, and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

1. THE proviso in the nineteenth Section of "The Jury Ordinance, 1858," that no remuneration or allowance whatever shall
