AN ORDINANCE to amend An Ordinance to facilitate the sale of Colonial Wine.

[7th July, 1865.]

WHEREAS in the second section of the Ordinance, twentyseventh year of Victoria, No. 14, of 1863, it is enacted,
that it should be competent for the Collector of Internal Revenue,
on application to him made and on payment of a fee of one pound,
to issue a license to sell by retail, Colonial Wine; And whereas it is
expedient to increase the fee for such license:—Be it therefore
enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and
its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Sale of Colonial Wine, Amendment.

License fee increased to £5.

1. ON and after the first day of January next, the fee payable to the Collector of Internal Revenue, on the issue of the license mentioned in the said in part recited second section of the said Ordinance, shall be the sum of Five Pounds.
