AN ORDINANCE to impose certain Fees on Licenses for Carriages in the City of Perth.

[7th July, 1865.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the law for the Licensing of Carts and Carriers in the City of Perth, and to impose certain fees upon certain Carriages in the said City; Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency The Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. THE Ordinances of the Legislative Council, No. 14, of 1850, Ordinances 14th Vict., 14, and No. 2, of 1854, in as far only as they apply to the said City of and 17th Vict., 2, repealed Perth, are hereby repealed.

Perth Carriage Fees.

No person in Perth to keep and use a carriage unless licensed. 2. IT shall not be lawful for any person residing in the said City of Perth, to keep and use therein any carriage described in the Schedule (I), and the rules therein, and not therein described as exempted, who shall not be the holder of a license issued under the provisions of this Ordinance.

Persons licensed may keep and use carriages. 3. EVERY person residing in the said City, who shall keep and use therein any carriage described in the Schedule (I), shall apply in writing for an annual license under this Ordinance, stating in such application the number and description of carriages so kept and used by such person; and such person shall, at the time of making such application, pay to the Chairman of the City Council of such City appointed under "The City of Perth Improvement Ordinance, 1858," the sum or sums set forth in the Schedule (I) as the proper fees to be paid in respect of the carriages described on making such application; and every such license shall be in force until the Thirty-first day of December inclusive in each year; and upon the receipt of such application and of the sum or sums of money hereinbefore referred to, the said Chairman shall issue a License in the form in Schedule (II) to the person making such application as aforesaid.

Persons not licensed keeping carriages liable to penalty and payment of duties. 4. IF any person residing in the said City shall, after the Thirty-first day of December 1865, keep and use in such City any carriage described in the said Schedule (I) as liable to the payment of fees, without being duly licensed under this Ordinance to keep and use the same, every such person shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Ten Pounds, upon conviction before one or more Justice or Justices of the Peace; And every such offender shall also be liable to the payment to such Chairman, of the full fees payable in respect of every carriage kept by such person, over and above the said penalty.

Application of fees and penalties.

5. EVERY fee received for a License under this Ordinance, shall and may be applied to the use of such City; and all shares of Penalties payable to Her Majesty in respect of any breach of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be payable to the like use of such City.

Sections of the Shortening Ordinance adopted. 6. SECTIONS A and C of "The Shortening Ordinance, 1853," shall be incorporated with and taken to form part of this Ordinance to all intents and purposes, and in as full and ample a manner as if the said sections had been introduced and fully set forth in this Ordinance.

Perth Carriage Fees.

THIS Ordinance shall come into force and take effect on Date of operation. and after the first day of January 1866.

8. IN referring to this Ordinance it shall be sufficient to use Name. the expression, "The Perth Carriage Fees Ordinance."

FEES payable annually on all LICENSES for carriages of any of the descriptions herein mentioned.

SCHEDULE (I.)

	Annual fee for each licensed carriage.
For every Carriage with two or four wheels, drawn by one or more horse, pony, ass, mule, bull, or bullock, or horses, ponies, asses, mules, bulls, or bullocks	£ s. d.
For every other Carriage with two wheels, drawn by one or more of the above-named animals	0 10 0
And for every other Carriage with four wheels, drawn by one or more of the above-named animals	1 0 0

Perth Carriage Fees.

RULES FOR CHARGING THE SAID FEES.

- 1. The said first mentioned fee to be charged for every waggon, van, cart, chaise-cart, or other such carriage which shall be kept to be used in the course of trade, or which shall be kept to be let out to hire.
- 2. The said two other fees to be respectively charged for every coach, landau, chariot, chaise, gig, dog-cart, sociable, caravan, curricle, cart, van, waggon, chair or car, and for every other carriage constructed for like purposes, by whatever name or names the same shall be called or known; and upon all such carriages hired by the month or any longer period, and upon all such carriages kept to let out to hire.
- 3. The fees on licensed carriages kept to be let out to hire to be paid by the person keeping the same for such purpose.

EXEMPTIONS.

- 1. Any cart or carriage belonging to Her Majesty or to the Governor.
- 2. Any carriage belonging to an officiating Minister of Religion.

LICENSE TO KEEP CARRIAGE.

Whereas A.
