An Ordinance to render more effectual an Ordinance, No. XV, 1844, called "An Act to prevent the spreading of the Infectious Disease called the Scab in Sheep in the Colony of Western Australia."

WHEREAS it is expedient to render more stringent the provisions now in force against the driving of sheep infected with the scab across the lands of persons not being the owners of such sheep: Be it thereof enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

Preamble.

I. THAT from and after the passing of this Ordinance, section the second of the Ordinance No. 15, 7th Victoria, 1844, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed, and that the word "land" in the first section of the said Ordinance shall be deemed and taken to include any Public Road.
