An Ordinance to repeal an Ordinance passed in the 12th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, No. 8, imposing duties on imported Goods, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.

HEREAS it is expedient to modify the existing duties Preamble.

payable on goods imported into Western Australia, and to provide for certain exemptions from Custom duties;—Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

Vict., repealed.

Ordinance No. 8, 12th I. THAT an Ordinance passed in the 12th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Ordinance to repeal certain Ordinances for imposing duties on imported goods, and for exemption of certain goods from duties, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof," shall be, and the same is hereby repealed, except as to goods already imported into the said colony, and warehoused therein, subject to the payment of Customs duties; upon which said goods the duties leviable under the said recited Ordinance shall be paid and levied, if the same be paid on or before the 30th day of June next.

Exceptions.

Duties leviable.

THAT upon all goods, wares and merchandize, enumerated in the first schedule hereunto annexed, and imported into the said colony after the passing of this Ordinance, there shall be levied and paid the duties respectively specified in the said schedule.

Collection of Duties.

III. THAT the duties specified in the said first schedule, shall be collected and levied in the manner provided by any Ordinance or Ordinances for the time being in force for the general regulation of the Customs of the said colony.

Goods free.

THAT the goods, wares and articles, enumerated in the second schedule hereunto annexed, shall and may, from and after the passing of this Ordinance, be imported into the said colony free of duty.

Governor can : exempt goods.

THAT it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon any special application made to him for that purpose, to exempt from the payment of duty any particular goods or article, which, under the special circumstances of the case, shall be deemed to merit such exemption.

Table of Duties.

ARTICLE.	PER.	RATE OF DUTY,

SCHEDULE NO. II.

Goods Free of Duty.

Animals, living Bread and Biscuit Bags and Sacks Bales for Wool Books, printed not being account Bottles, glass and stone, imported full Bran Bullion and Coin Baggage, personal of Immigrants Coals, Coke, and other Fuel Corn and other Grain Flour and Meal Implements and Machinery, Agricultural Meats, salted, cured and preserved, except Bacon and Hams Machinery for Mills, including Millstones Maps and Charts Oatmeal

Pumps and other apparatus for raising water

Pictures, Prints and Statuary

Plants, Seeds and Bulbs

Provisions or Stores, Military or Naval, required for Her Majesty's Service.

Pulse

Rice

Staves and Hoops for Casks

Specimens of Natural History

Uniform and appointments, Naval, Military, and Civil, imported by officers stationed in this colony for their own use.

Goods specially exempted by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council.
