An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance to provide for the establishment of a Scale of Pilotage fees and Light Dues passed in 1850, No. 2.

WHEREAS it is expedient to render vessels visiting Western Australia, and there receiving on board passengers or goods upon freight, liable to the payment of Pilotage Fees, and, for that

purpose, to amend an Ordinance passed in 1850, No. 2;— Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof—

I. THAT from and after the passing of this Ordinance, the 3rd section of the said Ordinance shall be read and construed as if there had been originally inserted therein immediately after the word “whatsoever” and before the word “in,” occurring in the second line of the said section the words following—that is to say—“ Or which shall receive on board any passenger or any goods upon freight;” and that this Ordinance shall be considered and taken as part of the said Ordinance.
