## An Ordinance for the Naturalization of John Simpkins Barker and Thomas Pope.

HEREAS John Simpkins Barker and Thomas Pope, citizens of the United States of America, have applied to be admitted to the rights and privileges of British subjects; and whereas, for the advancement of this colony, and in consequence of their continued good conduct and observance of the laws during a residence of some years therein, it is expedient to comply with the said application;—Be

it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that the said John Simpkins Barker and Thomas Pope be, and they are hereby naturalized, and enabled to purchase and hold lands, and to enjoy all other the privileges of natural-born British subjects within the limits of the Colony of Western Australia, save and except only the holding or exercising of any place or office of trust in the Courts of Law or connected with the Treasury therein.
