An Ordinance to facilitate mutual Postal Communication between this Colony and other Countries.

HEREAS it is expedient to facilitate the Postal Communication of this Colony with all other Colonies and Countries;

—Be it enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that the postage on all letters or packets, intended to be forwarded from this Colony to any other

Letters paid by means of Colony or Country, shall be prepaid by means of stamps, from and stamps. Colony or Country, shall be prepaid by means of stamps, from and after the first day of August.

II. THAT all letters and packets on which the postage, including the ship postage, has been prepaid into this Colony, from any Colony or Country reciprocating the same arrangement and advantages, shall be free from all further postal charges in this Colony, whether delivered in any part of this Colony, or passed in transitû to any other Country or Colony.
