An Ordinance to amend the "Public Slaughter House Ordinance, 1852."

HEREAS it has been found inconvenient to prohibit the slaughter of Cattle within three miles of the external boundaries of Townsites in which Public Slaughter Houses have been established, and it has therefore been deemed expedient to amend the Public Slaughter House Ordinance, 1852, in that particular; Be

it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof—

I. THAT from and after the passing of this Ordinance, Sections 7, 8, and 9 of the Public Slaughter House Ordinance, 1852, and the Form of Licence set forth in the Schedule to the said Ordinance and all Licenses granted, and to be granted, thereunder, shall be read and construed as if the word "Stock" had been originally used and inserted therein and throughout the same respectively, in the place and stead of the word "Sheep"; anything in the second section of the said Ordinance notwithstanding.
