An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the colony of Western Australia to theservice thereof, for the financial Year commencing First of April, One thousand eight hundred and forty-three.

WHEREAS power and authority have been vested in the Governor Preamble. of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the

II. > III. AND be it further enacted, that the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said sums to such persons, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or order signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct, and that the payment so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenue of the said Colony.

Receipts of parties to be a sufficient discharge to Treasurer.

> AND be it further enacted, that the said Taeasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and that the Receipt or Receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum
