An Ordinance for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the Colony of Western Australia to the service thereof, for the Financial Year commencing First of April, One thousand eight hundred and forty-seven; and for the further appropriating the said Revenue.
Wereas power and authority have been vested in the Governor of Western Australia, acting with the advice and
consent of the Legislative Council thereof, to make, ordain, and establish all such Laws and Ordinances as may be necessary for the maintenance of the peace, order, and good government of the same; Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Goveruor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that out of the produce of the Revenue of the said colony, there shall and may be issued and applied, any sum or sums of money not exceeding thirty-six pounds, five shillings, and one penny, for detraying the supplementary charge for the service of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, as detailed in the annexed schedule marked No. 1 .
II. AND be it enacted, that out of the produce of the Revenue of the said colony, there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums not exceeding nine thousand two hundred and twenty-one pourds, eighteen pounds, eighteen shillings, and two pence, for defraying the expences of those Establishments chargeable on the Colonial fund for the year commencing first of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven;-that is to say

For the expenditure of the Audit Office, any sum or sums not exceeding two hundred and seventy-five pounds.

For the expenditure of the Colonial Secretary's Office, any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred and twenty-five pounds.

For the expenditure of the Colonial Treasurer's Office, any snm or sums not exceeding fifty-nine pounds, twelve shillings, and sixpence.

For the expenditure of the Customs and Revenue Department, any sum or sums net exceeding eight hundred and twenty-five pounds.

For the expenditure of the Council Office, any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred and fifty pounds.

For the expenditure of the Ecclesiastical Department, any sum or sums not exceeding four hundred pounds.

For the expenditure of the Governor's Office, any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred pounds

For the expenditure of the Harbour-Master's Department, any sum or sums not exceeding three hundred and thirty-five pounds.

For the expenditure of the Judicial Department, any sum or sums not exceeding one thousand two hundred pounds.

For the expenditure of the Medical Department, any sum or sums not exceeding three hundred and forty-six pounds.

For the expenditure on account of Natives and Schools for Natives, any sum or sums not exceeding two hundred and sixty-five pounds.

For the expenditure on account of the Police Force, any sum or sums not exceeding four haudred and seventy-six pounds, twelve shillings, and sixpence.

For the expenditure of the Post Office Department, any sum or sums not exceeding six hundred and sixteen pounds.

For the expenditure on account of Public Works, any sum or sums not exceeding five hundred and sixty pounds.

For the expenditure of the Registrar of Births, Deaths, and Marriages' Office, any sum or sums not exceeding twenty pounds.

For the expenditure of the Registrar of Deeds' Office, any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred pounds.

For the expenditure on account of Roads and Bridges, any sum or sums not exceeding six hundred and seventy pounds.

For the expenditure on account of the Rottnest Establishment, any sum or sums not exceeding four hundred and sixty-six pounds, fifteen shillings.

For the expenditure on account of Schools, any sum or sums not exceeding two hundred pounds

For the expenditure of the Survey Department, any sum or sums not exceeding seven hundred pounds

For expenditure on account of Miscellaneous Services, any sum or sums not exceeding one thousand three hundred and thirty-one pounds, eighteen shillings and two-pence, as the details of the said expenditure are more particularly set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed, marked No. 2.
III. AND be it enacted, that the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said sums to such persons, for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or order sigued by him, shall from time to time order and direct, and that the payment so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenue of the said colony.
IV. AND be it evacted, that the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and that the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums of money as shall be therein mentioned, and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
