HEREAS it is necessary to provide for the service of the Preamble.

payment of certain unforescen expenses of the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, for which no provision was made in the estimate of that year; - Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that out of the produce of the Revenue of the said colony, there shall and may be issued and applied to defray the supplementary charge for charge for the year the service of the year ending on the thirty-first of December, one ending 31st Decem- thousand eight hundred and fifty, and not provided for in the ber 1849, £1,109 0s. Ordinance of that year, a sum not exceeding one thousand one hundred and nine pounds, as detailed in the annexed Schedule No. 1.

For 1850, £9,443 11s. IJ. AND be it enacted, that a sum not exceeding three thousand four hundred and forty-three pounds, nineteen shillings and tenpence, be charged upon the Revenue of the said colony for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and applied in the manner following;—that is to say,

For the expenditure of the Civil Establishment, a sum not exceed-Civil Establishment. ing five thousand one hundred and sixty pounds, nineteen shillings;

Revenue Services. For Revenue Services, exclusive of Establishments, a sum not exceeding sixty pounds;

Administration For Administration of Justice, a sum not exceeding two hundred Justice. and therty pounds;

For Charitable Allowances, a sum not exceeding sixty pounds; Charitable Allowances.

For Education, exclusive of Establishments, a sum not exceeding Education. ninety pounds;

For Hospitals, exclusive of Establishments, a sum not exceeding Hospitals. one hundred and eighty five pounds;

For Police and Gaols, exclusive of Establishments, a sum not ex-Police and Gaols. ceeding seven hundred and eighty pounds;

For Rent of Offices, a sum not exceeding twenty pounds. Rent of Offices.

For Transport and Travelling Expenses a sum not exceeding one Transport and Trahundred and ninety pounds; velling expenses.

For conveyance of Mails, a sum not exceeding three hundred and Conveyance of mails forty pounds;

For Works and Buildings, a sum not exceeding one hundred and Works and Buildings. fifty pounds;

For Roads, Streets, and Bridges, a sum not exceeding nine hun-Roads, Streets, and dred and ten pounds;

Bridges.

For Miscellaneous Services, a sum not exceeding one hundred and Miscellaneous Servicighty pounds;

For interest on Debentures, a sum not exceeding one hundred Interest on Debenpounds;

For the Surveyor General's Department, exclusive of Establishments, Surveyor General. a sum not exceeding Ten Pounds;

For Aborigines, a sum not exceeding two hundred and thirty-five Aborigines, pounds;

For the Harbour Master, a sum not exceeding one hundred and Harbour Master. thirty-seven pounds;

For Payments of Debts and Debentures, a sum not exceeding six Payment of Debts hundred pounds;

In the manner more particularly set forth and detailed under each head of expenditure respectively in the Schedule hereunto annexed, marked No. 2.

III. AND be it enacted, that the Colonial Treasurer shall issue Treasurer to pay sums and pay from time to time any sum or sums of money for the pur-specified as Governor poses hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums may order, respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons and and to be allowed in such portions as the Governor for the time being shall, by any or-creditin his accounts.
