An Ordinance to provide for the reduction or modification of the Toll upon Sandalwood, and for the appropriation thereof.

HEREAS in the tenth year of the Reign of Her present Ma-Preamble.

jesty an Ordinance was passed, by which it is enacted amongst other things, that a toll or charge of ten shillings shall be due and payable upon every ton weight of Sandal-wood cut and prepared for shipment, to the Collector of Revenue or Sub-Collector of Revenue

Revenue of the port whereat the same is intended to be shipped; and whereas by the eighth section of the said Ordinance a power is given to the Governor to suspend the operation of the said Ordinance for such time as he may deem expedient, but no provision is made for reducing or modifying the amount of the said toll, so as to meet any temporary depression or considerable fluctuation in the price of Sandal-wood; and whereas it is expedient to make such provision; Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent Government, with advice of the Legislative Council thereof, that it shall be lawful for the of Executive Council, to Governor, with the advice of the Executiv Council, by and Procladicing the amount of mation issued by him for that purpose from time to time, to reduce or Toll upon Sandal-wood. in any way to modify the amount of the said tell but so as in no in any way to modify the amount of the said toll, but so as in no case to raise it above the sum of ten shillings, as established by the Ordinance above mentioned.

Appropriation of proceeds

II. AND be it enacted, that all proceeds arising from the said toll shall, after deducting the expenses of collecting and managing the same, be paid over by the Collectors thereof to the Colonial Treasurer as a special account, and shall be appropriated to the construction and repair of roads, bridges, and other public lines of communication, by warrant of the Governor for that purpose.
