An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the Colony of Western Australia to the Service thereof, for the Financial Year commencing 1st April, 1835.

WHEREAS power and authority have been vested in the Governor of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, to make, ordain, and establish all such Laws and Ordinances as may be necessary for the maintenance of the Peace, Order, and good Government of the same; and whereas it is expedient to apply certain sums arising from the Revenue of the said Colony to the Service thereof for the Financial year commencing 1st of April, 1835:—Be it therefore enacted, by

May be applied out of the the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of Produce of Colonial Re-venue any sum not ex. the Legislative Council thereof, that out of the produce of the Re-ceeding £4,656 14 5 to venue of the said Colony there shall and may be issued and applied, support Establishment and Colonial and Colony there shall and may be issued and applied, chargeable on Colonial any sum or sums of money not exceeding Four thousand six hundred Fund for Financial Year and fifty six pounds fourteen shillings and fivepence sterling (£4,656 14s. 5d.) for defraying the expenses of those Establishments charge-able on the Colonial Fund for the year commencing 1st of April, 1835, as hereinafter more particularly expressed, that is to say, any sum or sums not exceeding Forty-five pounds twelve shillings and sixpence sterling (£45 12s. 6d.) to defray the Salary of the Office of Colonial Treasurer; and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds sterling (£100 0 0) to defray the Salary of the Office of Registrar of Deeds; and any sum or sums not exceeding Two hundred pounds sterling (£200 0 0) to defray the Salary of the Office of Collector of Revenue; and any sum or sums not exceeding Two hundred pounds sterling (£200 0 0) to defray the Salaries of two Harbour Masters, that is to say, one at Fremantle, and one at King George's Sound; and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds sterling (£100 0 0) to defray the Salaries of two Schoolmasters, that is to say, one at Perth, and one at Fremantle; and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds sterling (£100 0 0) to defray the Salary of Jailor at Fremantle; and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds sterling (£100 0 0) to defray the Salaries of the Offices of Constables; and any sum or sums not ex-Forty-five pounds twelve shillings and sixpence sterling (£45 12s. 6d.) Superintendent of Mount- to defray the Salary of the Office of one Superintendent of Police; and any sum or sums not exceeding Twenty-two pounds sixteen shillings and threepence sterling (£22 16s. 3d.) to defray the Salary of the Office of one Head Constable of the said Police; and any sum or sums not exceeding Ninety-one pounds five shillings sterling (£91 5s. 0d.) to defray the Salaries of five Constable of the said Police; and any sum or sums not exceeding Four hundred and fifteen pounds three shillings and ninepence sterling (£415 3s. 9d.) to defray the expenses of the Keep of seven Horses for the said Police; and any sum or sums not exceeding Thirty-one pounds eighteen shillings and ninepence sterling (£31 18s. 9d.) to defray the expenses of Stabling for the said Horses; and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred and ninety-one pounds twelve shillings and sixpence sterling (£191 12s. 6d.) to defray the expenses of Rations for the said Police; and any sum or sums not exceeding Thirty-one pounds eighteen shillings and ninepence sterling (31 18s. 9d.) to defray the expenses of Lodging Money for the said Police; and any sum or sums not exceeding One

hundred and fifty pounds sterling (£150 Os. Od.) to provide for the confidential clerk, Office of Confidental Clerk to the Governor; and any sum or sums not exceeding Fifty pounds sterling (£50 0s. 0d.) to defray the ex-Office Furniture, penses of Furniture and other necessary Equipments for the Public Offices; and any sum or sums not exceeding Six hundred pounds Surveys and Explorations, sterling (£600 0s. 0d.) to defray the expenses of Surveys and Explorations; and any sum or sums not exceeding Six hundred pounds Roads and Bridges, sterling (£600 0s. 0d) to defray the expenses of Roads and Bridges; and any sum or sums not exceeding Two hundred and fifty pounds Relief to Destitute, sterling (£250 0s. 0d.) to defray the expenses of giving Relief to Destitute Persons; and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds sterling (£150 0s. 0d.) to defray the expenses of an Institution for the Institution for the Institution of the Natives, comprising a Salary to a Director, and occasional gratuities in Flour, or otherwise; and any sum or sums not exceeding Two hundred and fifty pounds sterling Incidental Expenses in (£250 Os. Od) for defraying incidental expenses of the collection of collection of Revenue, the Revenue; and any sum or sums not exceeding Fifty pounds Postage of Public Letters, sterling (£50 0s. 0d.) for defraying the expenses of Postages of Public Letters; and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds at Fremantle, sterling (£100 0s. 0d.) for defraying the expenses of a Bonded Store and Office at Fremantle; and any sum or sums not exceeding Two hundred and fifty pounds sterling (£250 Os. Od.) for defraying ex-Allowances to Jurymen penses of Allowances to Jurymen and Witnesses in Criminal cases; and witnesses, and any sum or sums not exceeding Five hundred and Thirty pounds fourteen shillings and fivepence sterling (£530 14s. 5d.) to defray the expenses of Miscellaneous Contingencies which may arise in the Miscellaneous Contingencies. course of the year.

II. AND be it further enacted, that the Treasurer of the said Treasurer shall pay the Colony shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons, for sons as Governor, by warthe purposes hereinbefore mentioned, upon such days and in such such payments shall be proportions, as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or charged upon Revenues order in writing signed by him, shall from time to time order and of said colony. direct; and that the payments so to be made shall be charged upon, and payable out of, the Revenue of the said Colony.

III. AND be it further enacted, that the said Treasurer shall, in Treasurer shall, in counts, be allowed credit his accounts, from time to time, be allowed credit for any sum or for any sum or sums paid sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in rant, and the receipts of writing as aforesaid, and that the receipt or receipts of the respective the respective persons persons to whom the same shall be so paid, shall be a full and valid passing his accounts; discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts, for any and shall be allowed credit for the same accordingly

sum or sums of money as shall be therein mentioned; and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
