## An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the Colony of Western Australia to the Service thereof, for the Financial Year commencing Ist April, 1835.

WHEREAS power and authority bave been vested in the Governor of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, to make, ordain, and establish all such Laws and Ordinances as may be necessary for the maintenance of the Peace, Order, and good Government of the same; and whereas it is expedient to apply certain sums arising from the Revenue of the said Colony to the Service thereof for the Financial year commencing lst of April, $1835:-\mathrm{Be}$ it therefore enacted, by
