An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the Colony of Western Australia to the Service thereof, for the Financial Year commencing 1st of April, One thousand eight hundred and forty-one, and for further appropriating the said Revenue.

**W**HEREAS power and authority have been vested in the Governor of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony to make, ordain, and establish all such laws and ordinances as may be necessary for the maintenance of the peace, order, and good government of the same.

I. Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that out of the produce of the Revenue of the said Colony there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding four thousand six hundred and sixty-six pounds, two shillings, and one penny, for defraying the supplementary charge for the service of the year commencing first of April, one thousand

There shall be issued and applied £4,665 19s. 3d., for supplementary expenditure of 1840, viz.:

II. AND be it further enacted, that out of the produce of the Revenue of the said Colony there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums not exceeding eight thousand pounds, for defraying the Expences of those Establishments chargeable on the Colonial Fund for the year commencing first of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, as hereinafter more particularly expressed : that is to say, any sum or sums not exceeding forty-five pounds, twelve shillings, and sixpence, to defray the salary of the Colonial Treasurer, and any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Registrar of Deeds, and any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred pounds

III. AND be it further enacted, that the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said sums to such persons, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or order in writing so assigned by him, shall from time to time order and direct; and that the payment so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenue of the said Colony.

IV. AND be it further enacted, that the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time, be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrant or Order in writing as aforesaid, and that the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid, shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums of money as shall be therein mentioned, and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
