An Act to extend the Jurisdiction of Magisin Cases of Complaint between Masters and Servants.

Preamble.

THEREAS it is expedient to empower the Magistrates of this colony to hear and determine all cases of complaint by or against Masters and Servants of every description, whether domestic servants, servants in husbandry, or any other sort of servants, or by or against artificers, workmen, and labourers of every description employed to perform any work, whether by the hour, or by the day, or in any other manner in respect of time, or by the piece, or the job, or in any other manner in respect of work.

The several provisions

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Western Australia and of the English law, relative to disputes its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative between Master and Council thereof, That the several enactments and provisions of the Servant, shall apply to

English law relative to disputes between Masters and Servants, so far as serption in this Cothe same are applicable to the circumstances of this Colony shall be long. deemed and taken to apply to servants of every description as well domestic as otherwise, whatever may be the nature or the term of the service, and to artificers, workmen, and labourers of every description, employed to perform any work, whatever may be the nature or the mode of such employment,
