An Act for the Regulation of Pilotage and Shipping in the Harbours of Western Australia.

WHEREAS it is necessary to establish certain regulations for the Licensing and payment of pilots, and for the guidance and control of the Masters and crews of merchant ships resorting to the Harbours of this colony; Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor Proper Persons to be appropriated by the Governor of Western Australia, and its dependencies, with the advice of the pointed by the Governor Legislative Council that fit and proper persons shall from time to time be appointed by the said Governor to Act as pilots for the several Ports and Harbours of this Colony; and that every License for that purpose shall set forth the age, stature, complexion, and place of abode of every such pilot, and the Port or Ports for which he is thereby qualified to act.

Masters of Vessels not obliged to take Pilots.

Provided always, and be it further enacted, that it shall not II, be incumbent or obligatory upon the Master or Commander of any ship or vessel arriving at or off any of the Ports, or Harbours, of this Colony, or departing thence to Sea, to take on board any such Pilot as aforesaid.

Rates of Pilotage according to the table contained in Schedule.

III. AND be it further enacted, that the rates or fees of Pilotage to be paid by all ships or vessels arriving at or departing from any of the said Ports or Harbours, shall from time to time be fixed and published by the Proclamation or order of the said Governor; and that in the mean time, until the Publication of any such Proclamation or order, such rates of Pilotage shall be charged according to the table numbered 1 in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

Masters of Vessels to re-Harbour Master.

IV. V. AND be it further enacted, that if any goods shall be landed without Warrant from any ship or vessel in any of the ports or harbours aforesaid before pain of forfeiting goods such report and papers as aforesaid shall have been made and exhibited, so landed and a fine not and before such Warrants as aforesaid shall have been granted for the landing thereof, such goods shall be forfeited, and the master or commander of such last mentioned vessel shall forfeit any sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

No Servant to be arrested than £10.

AND be it further enacted that no Seaman forming party out of any Ship in Har-bour, for any debt less of the Crew of any ship or vessel in any of the ports or harbours aforesaid, shall be arrested or taken out of such ship or vessel, notwithstanding the same may be about to sail from this colony by virtue of any process issued out of any Civil Court of this Colony, on account of any debt, unless the person suing out such process shall first have made affidavit before the Judge or Commissioner of such Court that the debt so due from such seaman amounts to tne sum of Exceptions as to persons Ten Pounds at least. Provided always that the exemption from arresident in the Colony hiring themselves to serve rest hereinbefore contained shall not extend to such persons as shall have engaged themselves, while resident in this colony to serve on board any such ship or vessel as last aforesaid, so far as respects any debts, although less than Ten Pounds, by them contracted previous ly to the date of such their engagement.

And any such Master or Commander who shall deliver in a false content or statement, or shall sail or attempt to sail from any Port of Harbour of this colony without such clearance, shall for feit and pay:a sum not exceeding Fifty Pounds.

XVI. AND be it further enacted, that if the Master or Comman-masters of vessels neglectder of any ship or vessel arriving in any of the ports or harbours ment dispatches, or Pubaforesaid, shall wilfully neglect for the space of twenty four hours, ter or Government Residnext after such ship or vessel shall be anchored, to deliver to the ent within 24 hours after postmaster general at Fremantle or his deputy there, or to the go arrival subject to a penvernment Resident at any other of the ports or harbours aforesaid, any Government Dispatch or Public Mail, intended for this colony, and placed on board such ship or vessel for the purpose of being delivered in this colony, every such master or commander shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

EXVII. AND be it further enacted, that all fines and for feitures made of recovering Fines under this Act shall be recovered by summary conviction, on the oath conviction before two Jusof one witness before any two Justices of the Peace, and in case any tices of the Peace. such fine or forfeiture together with costs of conviction shall not be paid within the time mentioned by the order of the convicting Justices, it shall be lawful for such Justices to levy and raise the same by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender, and in case such goods and chattels shall be found insufficient for that purpose, to commit the offender or offenders to prison, there to be kept to hard labour for any time not exceeding six calendar months-

XVIII. AND be it further enacted that upon any such summary Right of Appeal in certain conviction as aforesaid when the sum adjudged to be paid shall ex-cases. ceed Five Pounds, or the imprisonment adjudged shall exceed one calendar month, any person who shall think himself or herself aggrieved by such conviction may appeal therefrom to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, upon giving notice of such appeal at the time of conviction, and also upon giving sufficient security to the satisfaction of the convicting Justices for payment of the costs of such appeal, and for abiding the Judgment of the Court, thereupon. And the said Court of Quarter Sessions shall hear and determine the matter of sucn appeal, and shall make such order therein in affirmance or reversal

versal of the conviction appealed from, with or without costs to either party as to the Court shall seem meet; and for that purpose shall summon all necessary parties and witnesses, and may enforce their order by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of any person refusing or neglecting to pay any sum of money thereby ordered to be paid, or may imprison such person (as also all other persons wilfully disobeying their said order) for any term not exceeding six calendar

XIX. AND be it further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the in suit for the benefit of said Governor to direct that any such bond as aforesaid shall be put in suit against the master or commander executing the same or his surety, or against both, for the benefit of any private person who shall find himself aggrieved by any Act committed by such masteror Commander, contrary to the Provisions of this Act.
