Door to Door Trading Regulations 1987

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Door to Door Trading* Regulations 1987¹.

2. Commencement

These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which the *Door to Door Trading Act 1987* comes into operation ¹.

2A. Contracts to which Act does not apply

- The Act does not apply to an electricity supply contract or a gas (1) supply contract.
- In subregulation (1) (2)

electricity supply contract means —

- a standard form contract; or
- a non-standard contract, (b)

as defined in section 47 of the Electricity Industry Act 2004;

gas supply contract means —

- a standard form contract; or
- a non-standard contract,

as defined in section 11WB of the Energy Coordination Act 1994.

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3. Certain contracts declared not to be prescribed contracts

A contract for the supply of goods or services by a benevolent organization formed for the relief of poverty or the advancement of religion or otherwise involved in charitable activities in the community is declared under section 6(3)(c) of the Act not to be a prescribed contract.

4. Size of printing or typewriting for the purposes of section 7(1)(i) of the Act

The printing or typewriting of the contract and the notices referred to in section 7(1)(i) of the Act shall be of a size not smaller than 10 point type.

5. **Forms**

The Forms set out in Schedule 1 are prescribed in relation to the matters specified in those forms.

Services excluded from application of section 8(2) of the Act 6.

Where it is not practicable by the nature of a service to delay its supply, that service is, under section 8(3) of the Act, excluded from the application of section 8(2) of the Act.

7. **Infringement notices**

- The offences specified in Schedule 2 are offences for which an (1) infringement notice may be issued under Part 2 of the Criminal Procedure Act 2004.
- The modified penalty specified opposite an offence in (2) Schedule 2 is the modified penalty for that offence for the purposes of section 5(3) of the Criminal Procedure Act 2004.

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- (3) The Commissioner may, in writing, appoint persons or classes of persons to be authorised officers or approved officers for the purposes of Part 2 of the Criminal Procedure Act 2004.
- (4) The Commissioner is to issue to each authorised officer a certificate, badge or identity card identifying the officer as a person authorised to issue infringement notices.
- In this regulation (5)

Commissioner has the same meaning as it has in the *Consumer* Affairs Act 1971.

You are also entitled to rescind the contract within 6 months of the date of the contract if there has been a breach of section 5, section 7 or Part III of the <i>Door to Door Trading Act 1987</i> .

- within 6 months of the date on which the contract was made (b) in the case of a rescission for a contravention of, or failure to comply with, section 5, section 7, or Part III of the *Door to* Door Trading Act 1987.
