### **Consumer Affairs Regulations 1972**

#### 1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Consumer Affairs Regulations 1972*<sup>1</sup>.

#### 2. Infringement notices

- (1) The offences specified in Schedule 1 are offences for which an infringement notice may be issued under Part 2 of the *Criminal Procedure Act 2004*.
- (2) The modified penalty specified opposite an offence in Schedule 1 is the modified penalty for that offence for the purposes of section 5(3) of the *Criminal Procedure Act 2004*.
- (3) The Commissioner may, in writing, appoint persons or classes of persons to be authorised officers or approved officers for the purposes of Part 2 of the *Criminal Procedure Act 2004*.
- (4) The Commissioner is to issue to each authorised officer a certificate, badge or identity card identifying the officer as a person authorised to issue infringement notices.

#### 3. Forms

The forms set out in Schedule 2 are prescribed in relation to the matters specified in those forms.

#### 4. Service of notices

Where pursuant to the Act or these regulations a person is required by notice in writing to —

- (a) give any information;
- (b) answer any question; or
- (c) produce any document,

that notice may be served on that person —

- (d) by delivering the notice to him personally;
- (e) by leaving the notice for him at his usual or last known place of abode, or at his usual or last known place of business or employment; or
- (f) by posting the notice as a registered letter addressed to him at his usual or last known place of abode, or at his usual or last known place of business or employment.

#### 5. Personating officers of Department etc.

- (1) A person who
  - (a) forges or counterfeits any warrant or document;
  - (b) makes use of any forged, counterfeited or false warrant or document;
  - (c) personates a person named in a document;
  - (d) falsely pretends to be
    - [(i) deleted]
    - (ii) the Commissioner; or
    - (iii) an officer of the Department;
    - or

commits an offence.

Penalty: \$200.

(2) A reference in this regulation to a warrant or document shall be construed as a reference to a warrant or document of a kind required under section 19(2) of the Act.
