# Hospitals (Services Charges) Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 2003

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

#### 1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Hospitals (Services Charges) Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 2003.* 

### 2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation on 1 July 2003.
