Notification of Stillbirth and Neo-Natal Death Regulations

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the Notification of Stillbirth and Neo-Natal Death Regulations ¹.

2. Notification of stillbirth or death of neonate

- (1) Where a medical practitioner gives a death certificate in relation to any child who died within 28 days of his birth, he shall notify the Executive Director, Public Health of the fact in the Form No. 1 in the Appendix, within 48 hours of the death certificate being given.
- A medical practitioner who contravenes subregulation (1) commits an offence and is liable to a penalty which is not more than \$1 000 and not less than —
 - (a) in the case of a first offence, \$100;
 - in the case of a second offence, \$200; and (b)
 - in the case of a third or subsequent offence, \$500.
