ROAD TRAFFIC AMENDMENT (MEASURING EQUIPMENT) ACT 1996

No. 37 of 1996

AN ACT to amend the Road Traffic Act 1974.

[Assented to 27 September 1996.]

The Parliament of Western Australia enacts as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the *Road Traffic Amendment* (Measuring Equipment) Act 1996.

Commencement

2. This Act comes into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.

Principal Act

- **3.** In this Act the *Road Traffic Act 1974** is referred to as the principal Act.

Section 98A amended

4. (1) Section 98A (1) of the principal Act is amended by inserting in the appropriate alphabetical position the following definition — $\frac{1}{2}$

"authorized person" means —

- (a) in relation to distance measuring equipment
 - (i) a member of the Police Force; or
 - (ii) a person certified by the Commissioner of Police as being competent to use the equipment;
- (b) in relation to speed measuring equipment
 - (i) a member of the Police Force; or
 - (ii) a person certified by the Commissioner of Police as being competent to use the equipment;

s. 4

- (2) Section 98A (3), (3a), (4) and (4a) of the principal Act are amended by deleting "a member of the Police Force" wherever it occurs and substituting the following $\frac{1}{2}$
- " an authorized person ".
- (3) After section 98A (4a) of the principal Act the following subsection is inserted $\,$

"

(4b) In any proceeding such as is mentioned in subsection (3) or (3a), a certificate purporting to be signed by the Commissioner of Police certifying that a person named in the certificate is, or was at the material time, a person certified by the Commissioner as being competent to use distance measuring equipment or to use speed measuring equipment is *prima facie* evidence of the matters in the certificate, without proof of the signature of the person purporting to have signed it or proof that the purported signatory was the Commissioner.
