SUPPLY.

No 43 of 1976.

AN ACT to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Five Hundred Million Dollars and from Moneys to Credit of the General Loan Fund Fifty Million Dollars, to the Service of the Year ending 30th June, 1977, and to apply out of the Public Account the Sum of Fifteen Million Dollars for the purpose of temporary Advances to be made by the Treasurer.

[Assented to 19th August, 1976.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Supply Act, 1976. Short title.

Issue and application of \$565 000 000. 2. There shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year from 1st July, 1976, to 30th June, 1977, the sum of Five Hundred Million Dollars out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, and from Moneys to Credit of the General Loan Fund Fifty Million Dollars; and there shall and may be issued and applied out of the Public Account the sum of Fifteen Million Dollars for the purposes of temporary Advances to be made by the Treasurer, and the Treasurer of Western Australia is hereby authorised and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorised to be issued and applied, and to make temporary Advances accordingly.

Sums available for purposes voted by the Legislative Assembly.

3. The said sums shall be available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor, under the provisions of the law now in force in respect of any Services voted by the Legislative Assembly during the financial year ending 30th June, 1977, or issued for such purposes, and all expenditure for the purposes of temporary Advances as aforesaid shall be recouped by charging the specific appropriation of Parliament applicable thereto, or by recovery thereof from the Governments or persons on whose account the advances may have been made.
