

INTERPRETATION.

No. 64 of 1972.

AN ACT to amend section 4 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1970.

[Assented to 31st October, 1972.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the *Interpretation Act Amendment Act, 1972.*

Short title and citation.

(2) In this Act the Interpretation Act, 1918-1970 is referred to as the principal Act.

(3) The principal Act as amended by this Act may be cited as the Interpretation Act, 1918-1972.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which the Public and Bank Holidays Act, 1972 comes into operation.

3. Section 4 of the principal Act is amended—

- (a) by substituting for the interpretation “Bank holiday” an interpretation as follows—

“Bank holiday” means a day that is appointed a bank holiday by or under the Public and Bank Holidays Act, 1972: ; and

- (b) by substituting for the interpretation “Public Holiday” interpretations as follows—

“Public half-holiday” means a part of a day that is appointed a public half-holiday by or under the Public and Bank Holidays Act, 1972:

“Public holiday” means a day that is appointed a public holiday by or under the Public and Bank Holidays Act, 1972: .
