GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS.

No. 61 of 1970.

AN ACT to amend the Government Railways Act, 1904-1967.

[Assented to 5th November, 1970.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

Short title and citation.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Government Railways Act Amendment Act, 1970.

- (2) In this Act the Government Railways Act, 1904-1967 is referred to as the principal Act.
- (3) The principal Act as amended by this Act may be cited as the Government Railways Act, 1904-1970.

2. Section 2 of the principal Act is amended by Amendment to S. 2. adding, after the interpretation "Goods", an interpretation as follows—

"Liquor" has the same meaning as it has in the Liquor Act, 1970:

Section 23 of the principal Act is amended by Amendment substituting for paragraph (25) a paragraph as (By-laws.) follows---

- (25) Regulating the sale, supply, and consumption of liquor in railway refreshment rooms, and on trains, that are under the management or control of the Commission and restricting, to the extent specified in the by-laws, the taking of liquor onto, or the possession of liquor on, any train, or a train specified in the by-laws, that is under such management or control:
- Section 64 of the principal Act is repealed and Repeal and re-enacted as follows-

re-enact-

64. (1) The Commission may from time to Lease for time, after calling tenders, lease for any period specified purposes. not exceeding three years, and on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit, any part of the land or buildings of a railway for the sale, subject to the provisions of the Liquor Act, 1970, of liquor pursuant to a railway refreshment room licence granted under that Act, the sale of other refreshments, books, or other articles or the use of the walls of any such building, or any part of the rolling stock, for the display of advertisements thereon.

(2) The Commissioner, as the Commission, sale and may sell or supply liquor, or authorise the sale supply of liquor. or supply of liquor, in railway refreshment rooms, or on trains, that are under the management or control of the Commission.
