Imperial Acts that operate in Western Australia fall into 2 categories -

- those of general application in force on 1 June 1829 when the State is deemed to have been established;
- those that have been expressly adopted by legislation enacted in Western Australia since 1 June 1829.

The Imperial Acts in the first category are not listed in this table unless they have been amended or are referred to in legislation enacted in Western Australia (e.g. the *Statute of Frauds (1677) (Imp)*).

The Imperial Acts in the second category which have not been expressly repealed by legislation enacted in Western Australia are listed in this Table together with the Acts that adopted them. It should be noted that the adopted Imperial Acts listed may be affected by Western Australian or Commonwealth Acts enacted since they were adopted. The text of most of the listed Acts is included in a reprint of Imperial Acts Adopting Acts as at 26 October 1999.
